

How to Keep Your Vehicles Safe & Reliable Best Advice from Chuck's Experts

During these cool days of autumn, we thought you might like to hear from the experts at Chuck's about the best way to prepare your vehicles for the ice and snow that is to come. They know very well which repairs people often let go too long and why they should not be neglected. Here's our best advice!

Don't take chances with your **BRAKES**. If you hear a loud screech when you hit the brakes, or if it is taking you longer to come



to a complete stop, or if your brake pedal feels spongy, your brake pads may be worn out. Brake pads come with small pieces of carbon steel that are wear depth indicators. We call them "screechers" because that's the noise they make when the pad is worn down. That screech lets you know it's time to come to Chuck's.

If you wait too long, you will damage your rotors, the brake calipers, and the pistons that push the calipers into position. Worse yet, the entire braking system could overheat and fail as your family car travels down the parkway at 60 miles an hour. It's a good idea to have them inspected a couple times a year. Don't let this one go.

Fast-moving parts create heat that will wear down your engine if it doesn't have proper lubrication, so stay up to date on **OIL AND FILTER CHANGES**. Over time, dirt and tiny metal shavings can cause erosion that will harm the engine and turn your car into a gas eater.

The Car Care Council reported that 22 percent of vehicles on the road have low or dirty engine oil. Don't let yours be one of them!

The sound of a metal chain clanking inside a cage at the rear of your vehicle or the firecracker noise of a backfire means your



EXHAUST system probably has a leak.

An exhaust leak or bad muffler can affect your vehicle's computer and compromise the efficiency and performance of your engine. This could result in additional costly problems.

Worse than damaging your vehicle, it could endanger your family because fumes could enter the car. We will diagnose and repair this problem right away.

Neglecting your transmission when service is needed can bring huge repair bills in the future. A **TRANSMISSION FLUSH** will help prevent transmission failure. The fluid is essential as a lubricant for moving parts that keep your transmission working properly. Over time small metal shavings and other contaminates will cause the transmission fluid to degrade.

If your engine has trouble starting or the electronics are not working as they should, your **BATTERY** may be at fault. The average vehicle battery lasts five years. Come to Chuck's and I will test see how much life it has left. Let's do this before you get stranded on winter roads.

The rubber that meets the road is your family's protection.

Your vehicle's **TIRES** do much more than give you a comfortable ride, they keep you safe.



Even while driving on dry, wellmaintained roads **BALD TIRES** are a danger to your family. But driving too fast or on wet, slippery roads with balding tires increase the chance of accidents 26 percent, according to the National Highway Traffic Safety Administration (NHTSA). Treads help cool the tire by allowing air to flow, but bald tires don't have grooves so heat builds up to unsafe levels. Tire blow outs can easily happen. In 2017, bald tires were blamed for accidents that killed 738 people. Hydroplaning is another problem. Grooves are shallow or don't exist at all on worn tires which makes them less effective at channeling water away from the tire.

As the tread wears away over time, the grooves become shallower, making them less effective at directing water away from the tire and a greater risk for **HYDROPLANING**. (See story on page 2)

Prepare now for winter and consider **SNOW TIRES** which have wider and deeper grooves than all-weather tires (which really, aren't) to minimize the dangers of spinning out on icy roads. Never drive in the snow on bald tires!

ROR of Hyrdoplaning e F What is it? Hydroplaning is when

planing is frightening.

What you should do: The goal is to slow down. Never use cruise control when driving in the rain or on wet roads, but if it was on before the rain began, turn it off immediately. Don't slam on the brakes, your car will lose all traction. Take your foot off the gas and turn your steering wheel in the direction the car is sliding. As your car slowly begins to straighten out, steer in the direction it is going. Once you've corrected the spin, pull over as soon as you can as you will

probably be quite flustered.

Prevent it: Remember that the most dangerous time to drive is during the beginning of a rain storm when oils that vehicles deposit in normal driving make the pavement slippery. If driving on wet pavement, follow tire tracks left by other vehicles. Slow down in heavy rain. Avoid sharp turns. Don't drive through puddles and standing water. And stay off of the painted road lines, they can be the slickest part of the road.
