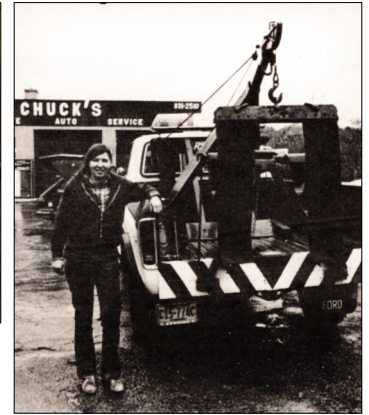

The Story of Chuck's

A love of cars and a knack for fixing them kept Chuck beneath a hood or under a vehicle in the street in front of his mom's house for most of his teenage years. This was when cars weren't bossed around by computers and a handy wrench and a few other tools were all a good mechanic needed.

Chuck cleaned the transmissions he removed from vehicles in his mom's bathtub. As she became more unhappy about this, Chuck became a regular at a neighbor's one-bay garage where he learned by watching the pros and helped out as often as asked. In 1966, a couple years after high school graduation, Chuck joined the U.S. Marine Corps. While still serving in the reserves, in 1969, he opened a two-bay garage and Texaco gas station on West Liberty Avenue in Dormont. The clean, well-kept station attracted the attention of an Esso representative who suggested that Chuck open an Esso gas station and garage at a little building that was for rent in Upper St. Clair.

Three other auto repair shops lined the street, but even so, in 1970, Chuck opened a two-bay garage and gas station at 75 McMurray Road. "It was the best decision I ever made," he said. "My goal was to give the best service and most reliable repairs to every customer who walked in my door."

Esso became Exxon and in order to sell their gas, Chuck's was required to be open 7 a.m. -11 p.m. seven days a week. For three years Chuck pumped gas and fixed cars before he could afford to hire a gas station attendant. Chuck soon added tow trucks to his services. At one time Chuck's had seven tow trucks that made 300 calls a month pulling people out of creeks, yanking them back up hills, changing flats, jumpstarting batteries, and towing some to Chuck's for repairs. Chuck bought the building in 1978, the year he met Lynn. She worked as a draftsman for a nearby engineering firm and stopped in
